Looking Back at 2019...



The 26th American Peptide Symposium (and 11th International Peptide Symposium) was held June 22-27, 2019 in the coastal city of Monterey, California. The theme for the conference was "Catch the New Wave of Peptide Science". The program included 85 speakers including inspiring keynote addresses by Prof. Frances Arnold of California Institute of Technology (opening night), and Prof. Helma Wennemers of ETH Zurich (closing day). Other program highlights included talks on a wide range of areas spanning peptide drugs, protein-protein interactions, peptide macrocycles, designer peptide mimetics, protein engineering, methodological innovations, peptide ligand screening, and peptide nanomaterials. Prof. Lila Gierasch accepted the Merrifield Award; Profs. Annette Beck-Sickinger and Hiroaki Suga were presented with the Vincent du Vigneaud Award; Prof. Xuechen Li presented the Makineni lecture and Prof. Fernando Albericio delivered the Goodman Lecture. A new addition to the Symposium was the Early Career Lectureships with talks given by Profs. Monika Raj and Jevgenij Raskatov. The conference was wellattended, with 638 registrants from all over the globe and spanning industry, academic and government institutions.
