

Call for Nominations: 2023 APS Early Career Lectureship

The American Peptide Society is accepting nominations for the 2023 Early Career Lectureship which will be presented at the 28th American Peptide Symposium held in Scottdale, Arizona June 24-29,
2023. This honor recognizes an early career investigator who has contributed innovative work to the field of peptide science. The recipient will deliver a talk in a session appropriate to their work at the 28th American Peptide Symposium.

Nominating documents should be submitted by January 9th, 2023.

Eligibility:

To be eligible, a nominee with a tenure-track appointment should be at Assistant Professor rank, or equivalent, as of the award nomination due date. All other nominees should have no more than 12 years post-Ph.D. research experience as of the nomination due date. Exceptions to these eligibility requirements may be made for candidates with extenuating circumstances upon approval of the Committee Chair.

Nomination Deadline:

January 9, 2023

Nomination Process:

Nominations for the APS Early Career Lectureship should include the following items, assembled into a single PDF file.

- 1. A letter of nomination from the primary nominator, 1,000-word limit.
- 2. The nominee's Curriculum Vitae and list of publications.
- 3. Up to three scientific papers authored by the nominee.

The recipient must be able to attend the 28th American Peptide Symposium held in Scottdale, Arizona, June 24-29, 2023, to present their work.

Previous nominations considered for the 2022 Early Career Lectureship may be reviewed for a second time, as long as the nominee is still eligible.

The recipient will deliver a talk at the Symposium, Keynote lecture length, in a session appropriate to their work. The APS will support the awardee's registration, lodging at the conference hotel, and up to \$1000 in travel expenses.
